Clean up run

- Context: clean up a finished run** The confirm shown by the recycle icon on a run's row (**Experiments → runs pane**) and by **Run detail → Clean up run** — the same dialog from either place. Cleanup is **archive-first by default**: transcripts + scorecards are written to storage before anything is deleted, and only done / aborted runs qualify (a running run is protected). Only runs that have **finished** or been **stopped** can be cleared — a run that's still going is protected.
- Archive first — the default, not a wall** Ticked by default: the complete archive (every exchange and candidate answer, the scorecard, and a header naming the run's conditions) is written to durable storage as `xlsx / csv / json` *before* anything is deleted, and its object key lands in the `audit_log` entry. **If that write fails, nothing is deleted**: the dialog says so and offers Retry. Unticking is allowed — a botched run should not force an archive nobody wants — but it is a warned choice: the acknowledgment below changes to “this data cannot be recovered,” and the audit entry records that no archive was taken (ALGORITHMS §13).
- Cancel without clearing anything.
